KAMARAJAR BIRTH ANNIVERSARY, "KALVI VALARCHI NAAL" CELEBRATIONS.

One of the great Legends of Tamil Nadu, Mr. Kumaraswami Kamaraj, was born on 15th July, 1903 to Mr. Kumaraswami and Mrs. Sivami. He was an Indian freedom fighter, and served as the Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu from 1954 to 1963. He was also the President of the Indian National Congress.

He introduced the 'Midday Meal Scheme' to provide free meals to school children, to increase school attendance and reduce drop outs. He focused on expanding educational access, particularly in rural areas. He has left a lasting impact on Tamil Nadu development and Education System.

He is known as the 'Kingmaker' in Indian politics. He is remembered for his simplicity, integrity and Commitment to public welfare.

We are proud of him and his birthday is Commemorated as 'the Education development day' in Tamil Nadu. Even till this day his house at Virudhunagar and Chennai have been turned into a place of his remembrance. He was awarded the Bharath Rathna in 1976, and a stamp (25 paise) was released in Chennai. His photo was opened and kept in the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly. The Chennai Beach road, the Madurai University and the third ship purchased by India were named after him. He hailed from a humble family, was always simple, worked hard and was selfless. He prioritized the construction of roads, bridges and irrigation projects to boost agriculture in Tamil Nadu. He died on October 2, 1975. He will always be in our memory for all the work he had done for the development of our state.

PRIZE DISTRIBUTION CEREMONY FOR KALOTSAV WINNERS & TRAFFIC RULES AND ROAD SAFETY

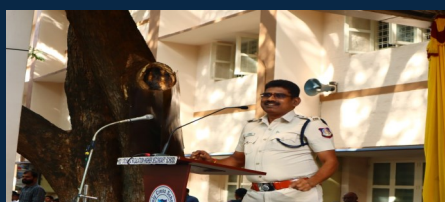

LONGER PASSWORD IS STRONGER PASSWORD

How do you have a “strong” password that is easy to remember?

While it may seem tough to do this, there are a few simple tips that can make it easy.

Choose...

- # The combination of several characters will produce a strong password.
- # Use a mix of alphabetical and numeric characters.
- # Use a mixture of upper- and lowercase; passwords are case sensitive.
- # Use symbols if the system allows
- # Use a combination of letters and numbers, or a phrase like “many colours” using only the consonants, e.g., mnYc0l0rz or a misspelled phrase, e.g., 2HotPeetzas or ItzAGurl .
- # A combination of two unrelated words like cementhat
- # An acronym for an easy to remember quote or phrase (see below)
- # A deliberately misspelled term, e.g., Wdn-G8 (Wooden Gate) or HersL00kn@U (Here’s looking at you).
- # Replace a letter with another letter, symbol or combination, but don’t be too obvious about it.
- # Makes your password longer and is not as obvious
- # Two words separated by a non-alphabetic, non-numeric, or punctuation character, e.g., PC%Kat or dog,~1#

Do Not Choose...

- # Your name in any form — first, middle, last, maiden, spelled backwards, nickname or initials.
- # Any ID number or user ID in any form, even spelled backwards.
- # Part of your userid or name.
- # Any common name, e.g., Sunday, Apple Tree.
- # Passwords of fewer than six characters.
- # The name of a close relative, friend, or pet.
- # Your phone or office number, address, birthday, or anniversary.
- # Acronyms, geographical or product names, and technical terms.
- # Any all-numeral passwords, e.g., your license-plate number, cell phone number.
- # Names from popular culture, e.g., Ramayana, Mahabarath , Harry_Potter, Jurassic Park,.
- # A single word either preceded or followed by a digit, a punctuation mark, up arrow, or space.
- # Words or phrases with all the vowels or white spaces deleted.
- # Words or phrases that do not mix upper and lower case, or do not mix letters or numbers, or do not mix letters and punctuation.
